Dear Members

We will all be glad to see the back of winter, let us hope the worst of the weather is over and we can be looking forward to spring and a successful foaling season.

Last year was somewhat unsettled for the Society due to the immense changes in the office as detailed in previous newsletters but from now on we will see some really positive results. Some delays have occurred due to the immense volume of work the staff have undertaken. I do thank members for their patience and understanding during this period and am glad to say that we have had very few complaints. The SPSBS Council is united in its aim to address the problems of the past and to make sure the Society is run efficiently and fairly for **all** members. Both the Vice-President and I have been determined that during our time in office the Council would put in place a system whereby every member of staff is thoroughly familiar with all procedures involved with the running of the Society.

More Council members are now assisting our staff with the general management of the Society which is good to see. Previously we had the ridiculous situation where Council (the employer after all) never met the staff as Council meetings were at weekends, a recipe for disaster! Council meetings have become much more efficient and are now held on a Friday only when a full agenda is thoroughly dealt with.

It is perhaps worth reminding members that at present Council members do not have their expenses paid for attending meetings four times a year.

The economic downturn will no doubt give responsible breeders food for thought regarding whether to put all mares in foal again although our breed usually seems to survive recessions better than most. Each year the number of foals registered has been increasing and this enthusiasm shows good support for the breed. Unfortunately, we also have the extra burden of costs of the new microchipping legislation. Council is doing its utmost to keep costs in check and not increase fees, although there has been an increase from the Animal Health Trust for DNA testing.

Council is looking at various locations for future Breed Shows which will be based in the North, Middle and South of the country in rotation with it being offered every ten years to the Shetland Islands. This year's Breed Show will be in the Islands and details are available for those who are attending and travelling with ponies. There is a whole week of celebrations to make a visit well worthwhile. I hope many of you will be able to attend and I look forward to seeing you there at the AGM.

Plans are underway for the International Show in 2010 in England and suitable prestige venues are being sought near to easily accessible airports to encourage visitors from abroad. We shall be looking to raise as much sponsorship as possible to ensure this will be a truly memorable event. Following a marked increase in complaints about judges, Council is currently drafting a complaints procedure for consideration.

We are currently in the process of organising a meeting for all International Stud-Books and this has been met by them with great enthusiasm as the way forward for the exchange of dialogue and ideas. Long may it continue.

Shetland Pony Trading Limited is at last trading as a separate trading company with its own board and board meetings as required by law and plans are being made to improve the marketing of merchandise. As ever I am only too happy to discuss any matters with members (best contact is during office hours on 01722 426 974 or home on 01962 771 213).

# VAT INFORMATION

The recent decrease in VAT to 15% was discussed by Council. There has been no increase in our Society charges for a long time as Council has managed to keep these at the same level by making savings elsewhere. Inevitably though, inflation would have had to result in some increases in fees. However, as the VAT has been reduced temporarily it was decided that for the time being fees would remain the same.

# **DNA KITS - Price increase**

The Animal Health Trust has announced that due to increasing costs they can no longer hold prices for DNA testing at the 2007 level and will have to increase their charge. Therefore as from the 1st MARCH 2008 the DNA kits will cost £45.

# **VOLUNTARY VETTING increase in charges**

Due to the increase in DNA testing from £40 to £45 the Voluntary Vetting Examination for stallions will increase from £60 to £65. This charge covers the DNA test fee, administrative fee and microchip. The charge is £15 for a colt that is already DNA tested and microchipped.

# Northern Shetland Enthusiasts Visit to Beamish Open Air Museum County Durham

Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup> March saw the Northern Shetland Enthusiasts brave a brisk wind and snow flurries to visit the world famous Beamish Museum.

Organised through Carol and Trevor Shaw at Stonecellars Stud some 50 people enjoyed a guided tour by two of the museum's staff who work with the horses on site.

Beamish provides living examples of actual 1913 life in the county of Durham. The heavy horse section was very popular with the Gelderlanders attracting many accolades along with the Vaux Brewery Horses. Carriages and carts of all types were in abundance.

The harness room made people draw breath at the variety and grandeur of many of the exhibits; several of which are currently used for competition and ceremonies; including the Queen's procession at Ascot.

Visiting a Colliery Lamp House was the precursor to a trip down an actual mine (drift not deep) which saw the taller members of the group having to bend double to gain access – no mean feat for those with creaky joints!

For many a special highlight was the fully harnessed Shetland Pony which represented a working pit pony. Recently the museum reported the death of their original pony "Pip" who was 35 and a very popular attraction. The replacement pony was acquired two years ago from the local Butterby Stud and is a chestnut gelding with the pit name of "Flash"

Visits to the sweet shop, pub, tea room, bank and newly built Masonic Hall ensured a most enjoyable day.

Without exception people said that they had thoroughly enjoyed their visit from the youngest aged six to our senior member Mrs Newall at 85.
