Dogs must be kept on leads at all times whilst on the Showground and it is the responsibility of the owners to clean up after their dogs.

Catering facilities will be available after the AGM (to be booked in advance, see below) and throughout the day on Sunday.

Stabling, shavings, haylage, hook up and Saturday evening meal available on the Showground.

Camping is allowed on site.

The showground gates will be open from midday to 10pm on Saturday 16th August and re-open at 5am on Sunday 17th August 2025.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society. Spot checks may be carried out.

SPSBS Breed Show 2025 General Rules and Conditions of Entry

- 1. All ponies entered must be registered or eligible for registration in the SPSBS Stud book.
- 2. All ponies must be named on the Entry Form. No entries will be taken on the day.
- 3. Judging to commence at 8.00 am and will not be delayed under any circumstances. Once judging of a class has commenced, no late arrivals will be admitted to the ring. It is the responsibility of the Competitor to be in the ring on time.
- 4. The Show Committee reserves the right to amend, amalgamate or cancel any class and to replace a Judge if necessary.
- 5. The decision of the Judge(s) and the Show Committee is final Any objection must be made IN WRITING to the Secretary within ONE HOUR of the alleged incident, together with a deposit of £50, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
- 6. Foals must be over 5 weeks of age.
- 7. Three-year-old fillies with foal at foot may not be shown.
- 8. Brown ponies are classed as black
- 9. Ridden and Driven ponies must be 4 years old or over, and no lactating mares in ridden or driven classes
- 10. Colts and Stallions 2 years and over must be shown bitted and it is advised they wear a stallion bridle disc
- 11. Stallions and colts (except foals) may not be shown in hand by children under 14 years; or ridden by children under 12 years There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handler classes

 Correctly secured current British Standard skull cap or riding hat must be worn by riders whilst mounted on the showground, cones drivers, and handlers aged 14 years and under
- 12. A Novice pony is one not to have been placed 1st in any class prior to the closing date of entries.
- 13. A pony is eligible to compete in one ring only with the exception of Ridden, Driven, Young Handler, Progeny and Veteran Classes, and Classes 41-44.

- 14. If any pony is found to be suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, it must be removed from the Showground immediately upon the request of the Show committee or the Vet.
- 15. The organisers shall not be liable for injury or loss from any cause or circumstance whatsoever to any person, animal, or property. It is a condition of entry that each exhibitor and competitor shall indemnify the show against any such matters.
- 16. Only one handler per pony is permitted in the In-Hand classes
- 17. Exhibitors must be appropriately dressed, and no individual stud, person or pony names displayed in the ring.
- 18. All riders in the Open Ridden class must be of a suitable height and weight for the pony they are riding.
- 19. Ponies in the Ridden classes must be shown in a suitable bitted bridle.
- 20. Whips may be no more than 30 inches long and spurs are not permitted.
- 21. Should a rider fall off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, with the rider dismounted and take no further part in that class.
- 22. Exhibitors should be aware, a Judge may not:
 - a. place a pony which to his/her knowledge has been bred, sold, leased, or produced by the judge or his/her immediate family, partner, business partner or employer.
 - b. place a pony in which he/she has had a financial interest since 1st January of the preceding year.
 - c. place a stallion by whom he/she has had a mare stinted in this season. preferably on the appropriate panel of judges, should be appointed by the Show Secretary to place the pony in question in its position in the class
 - d. judge any rider/handler who has shown a horse/pony owned, produced, or trained by him/her since 1st January of the preceding year. Should a situation arise when such a pony appears a referee,
- 23. No ponies to be left on a parked vehicle overnight.
- 24. Mobile phones must be switched off whilst in the ring
- 25. Where classes are affiliated to societies other than the SPSBS the other society rules take precedence.
- 26. Classes 1-7, 9-19, 21-31, 33-36, 46-50, a51-54 are judged under the rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of the Shetland Pony Stud- Book Society. Part-breds are not eligible for Mountain & Moorland Classes.
 - Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members and at breed shows ponies can qualify for finals even if their owners are not members. Owners of qualified ponies must become adult Qualifying or Life members to enter the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern 2026.
 - The highest placed pony, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.
 - NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd. Home Produced Ridden Championship Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.
- 27. Annual Equine Influenza vaccinations are required. The full course or booster must have been administered at least 7 days before the competition. Foals under 6 months of age are exempt.
 - An initial course of two injections for primary vaccination, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart, are required before being eligible to compete.
 - A first booster injection must be given between 150 and 215 days after the second primary vaccination. Subsequent booster injections must be given at regular intervals of not more than 12 months.
 - The most recent booster injection must have been given within 12 calendar months prior to the pony competing.

In Hand Classes (excluding foals) are qualifiers for the Price Family In Hand Semi Final at the National Pony Great British In-Hand Show at Vale View Equestrian Centre, 14th September 2025, which is a qualifier for Horse of the Year Show, NEC 8th- 12th October 2025. The object of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses)

All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 **must** wear a hard hat. We recommend a correctly secured skull cap/riding hat that meets one of the current BSI standards should be worn when in a carriage or in attendance to the turnout.

Qualifying for the BDS Iceline Yorkshire Ltd National Championships: The highest place turnout in the designated type-section in each qualifying class, disregarding those already qualified down to 6th place in the class, will qualify for the 2025 National Driving Championship Semi-Finals at Addington Equestrian Centre on the 20th September as follows:

Riders must not compete in both the Mountain & Moorland Lead Rein/First Ridden Pony of the Year and the Mountain and Moorland Pony of the Year.

This class will be run in accordance with the general rules as set out in the Horse of the Year Show rulebook, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.
